Ramya Harishankar is a well-known exponent of Bharata Natyam, and an acclaimed teacher of the art. She began her rigorous training under Kalaimamani Rajaratnam, a disciple of Vazhavoor Ramiah Pillai, who imparted to her the exacting tradition of the Vazhavoor style. She continued her tutelage under Kalanidhi Narayanan, the finest exponent of abhinaya. She received immediate recognition after her arangetram in 1970. She has given over 100 performances in India and South-east Asia, and won critical acclaim wherever she performed.

Since 1981, Ramya has been fostering the art in the USA by giving performances and choreographing dance productions. As director of ARPANA, a premier school of Bharata Natyam in Southern California, Ramya trains her students with meticulous care and dedication. She is currently touring the United States performing in over 20 cities.

"Kalaimamani" Swamimalai K. Rajaratnam, who will provide nattuvangam, was born in a family of music scholars and trained by the doyen Vazhavoor Ramiah Pillai. He is the leading guru of Bharata Natyam in India today. With his brilliant nattuvangam and creative choreography, he won the recognition of critics and connoisseurs alike. Founder of Rajaratnalaya in Madras, he has trained more than 200 students during his 25 years of service to the art.

- **D.** Kannan, the *mridangam* accompanist, comes from a family of musicians, his father being the renowned *mridangam* player Nellai Devaraja Iyer. Kannan has accompanied several senior artists, and is a much-sought-after accompanist for Bharata Natyam recitals.
- A.N. Bhagyalakshmi, the *flute* accompanist, is a disciple of the well-known flutist N. Ramani. She has performed solo, and has accompanied many leading dancers.

Directions to Stein Auditorium

- 1. Traveling East on Schuylkyl Expwy (I-76) take exit for South street. Turn right on south street. Follow directions 7.
- 2. Traveling West on Schuylkyl Expwy take exit for South street and turn left on South Street. Follow the directions 7.
- 3. From Walt Whitman bridge take Schuylkyl Expwy West and follow directions 2 and 7.
- 4. From **Ben Franklin** bridge take Vine street expressway to Schuylkyl Expwy East and follow directions 1 and 7.
- 5. From **Penna Turnpike** take exit 25 for I-476. Follow I-476 South to I-76 East (Schuylkyl Expwy). Then follow directions 1 and 7.
- 6. From NJ turnpike take exit 4 to Philadelphia. Go across Ben Franklin bridge and follow directions 4 and 7.
- 7. From **South street** right turn on 33rd street and travel 3 blocks to Market street for the auditorium.

Parking: Metered parking is available on both sides of Market, Chestnut and Walnut streets. Besides, parking is also available on 33rd, 34th, 32nd and the side streets around Stein Auditorium.
