T.R.SUBRAMANIAM, Sangeetha Vidwan from Government Music College secured the FIRST RANK in 1957. He is a deciple of Sangitha Kalanidhi Late Musiri Subramania Iyer. T.R.Subramaniam, well known for his expertise in PALLAVI singing, is crowned as the PALLAVI KING of Carnatic Music. He is an Associate Professor of Music at Delhi University, New Delhi, India. This is his THIRD tour of the United States of America. He has traveled all over the world to U.K., Singapore, Australia, Japan, Hong Kong and many other countries. He has also given Lecture - Demonstrations at Oxford and Cambridge Universities. T.R.Subramaniam has performed all over India and his concerts are well appreciated by all music lovers.

VASANTHA KANNAN learnt vocal music at Guru Guha Gana Vidhyalaya at Calcutta. Later she learnt violin from her mother Mrs. Jaya Shankar. Vasantha was awarded the FIRST prize in A.I.R. Music competition held in 1968. She has accompanied all leading vidwans including T.R.Subramaniam, S. Ramanathan, N.Ramani, Balamurali Krishna, Volleti Venkateswaralu, MLV and many others. Vasantha is an A Grade artiste of All India Radio, Madras. She has also performed a number of times on T.V.

TRICHUR MOHAN had initial training from Kodai Vahoor Radhakrishna Iyer and later from the great Palghat Mani Iyer, Umayalpuram Sivaraman and Karaikudi Mani. He has accompanied the great stalwarts like Chembai, Semmangudi, Balamurali, T. V. Sankaranarayanan etc. He has performed in U.S.A. with L.Subramaniam, Pandit V.C. Jog and Ustad Bismillah Khan. Trichur Mohan has also participated in the Festival of India Program in Moscow and Geneva.

Directions to Community Y at Primos:

- 1 (a) From Northern and Western suburbs travel South on Pa. Rte. 320. Go past the intersection with Rte 1., turn left on to Pa. Rte 420 South within 200 yards. You will see DRY GOODS STORE on your left.
 - (b) Travel about 3 miles on Rte 420 South to the intersection of Baltimore Pike (Chevy Dealer on your left and Hyundai Dealer on your right at the intersection).

 Turn left onto Baltimore Pike.
 - (c) Travel about 2 miles on Baltimore Pike you will go past Bazaar on your right. Turn right onto Oak Ave(Pizza Hut is at the intersection and on your right) and at the First Traffic light turn right onto Bunting Lane. You will see a small sign for the Community Y. Community Y is on your right within 200 yards. Parking is behind the building.
- 2.(a) From New Jersey cross Walt Whitman Bridge to I-95 South. or From Delaware take I-95 North:
 - (b) Take Prospect Park Exit onto Rte.420 North. Travel about 3-4 miles on Rte. 420 to Baltimore Pike (Mitsubhishi Dealer on your right and Strawbridge and Clothier on your left at the intersection with Baltimore Pike).

 Turn right onto Baltimore Pike and follow the instructions in 1(c).
- 3. From North East Philadelphia travel South on Rte. 1 to Rte. 320 intersection. Turn left onto Rte 320 South and turn left onto Rte. 420 South within 200 yards. You will see DRY GOODS STORE on your left. Follow the instructions in 1(b) and 1(c).
- 4. From Center City Phila: Travel about 8-9 miles westbound on Baltimore Ave. Turn left onto Oak Ave. At first traffic light, turn right onto Bunting lane.
 Community Y is within 200 yds. on your right.
 {Landmarks: *On Baltimore Ave., you will pass K-mart on your right.
 *There is a Pizza Hut on the left of Baltimore Ave. at the Oak Ave. intersection.}
