**“Mandolin” Uppalappu Srinivas** is a prodigy with extraordinary musical abilities. He started to compose and give public performances at the tender age of 12. He learnt to play light music on the mandolin from his father Sathyanarayana. His initial training in classical music was under Subbaraju, a family friend. Subbaraju played a pivotal role in the development of Srinivas’ extraordinary talent by providing him with the right environment and guidance. Srinivas’ exceptional memory, his ability to grasp the finer points of music by merely listening to a piece once, and his sense of rhythm have made connoisseurs and common people alike marvel at his musical feats. At 21, he is now one of the foremost artists in carnatic music. He has been bestowed with the prestigious titles of **Bala Bhaskara, Sangeetha Choodamani** and **Swarna Kishore**. He has traveled worldwide and has performed in Australia, France, Malaysia, Singapore, the UK and the USA.

**Kalaimamani Sikkil R. Bhaskaran** hails from a family of music scholars. He was introduced to the violin at an early age of 11 by Thiruvarur Subbaiyar. Later he continued his tutelage under Mayavaram Govindaraja Pillai and Kumbakonam Rajamanickam Pillai. He has been giving public performances since the age of 18. During the past 30 years of his music career, he has accompanied many leading musicians. Since 1976, he has been working for AIR, Madras. He has won numerous awards and commemorations - **Junior Artiste of the Year (1961)**, **Innisai Kalaimani**, **Senior Vidwan of the Year (1980)** and **Kalaimamani**, to cite a few.

**Padmasri Palghat R. Raghu** had his initial training under Tinnium Venkatarama Iyer. He later went on to receive rigorous training under Palghat Mani Iyer, the greatest mridangam maestro. With his distinct style, virtuosity, genial temperament, poise and fine musical awareness, Raghu has established himself as one of the foremost mridangists of our time. During the past fifty years of his career, he has accompanied many great musicians. He is widely traveled and has performed in the Soviet Union, Germany, France, the UK and the USA.

#### Directions to Paxon Hollow Junior High School

1. Traveling South on PA-320 (Sproul Road) drive about 1.5 miles after intersection with PA-3, to Paxon Hollow Road. Turn right on Paxon Hollow Road. The School is about half mile mile on your left. Parking lot is in front of the building.
2. Traveling North on PA-320 (Sproul Road), drive nearly 1.5 miles after the intersection with US-1, turn left on Paxon Hollow Road immediately after the Lawrence Park Shopping center. Follow directions 1.
3. Traveling West on PA-3 (West Chester Pke), turn left on Lawrence Road immediately after the Haverford Memorial Hospital (on your left) and Pathmark is on your right on Lawrence Road. Lawrence Road ends on Sproul Road (PA-320). Turn right on Sproul Road and immediate left on Paxon Hollow Road. Follow directions 1.
4. Traveling East on PA-3 (West Chester Pke) turn right on Springfield Road (Bradlees on your right). Springfield Road joins Sproul Road (PA-320). Follow directions 1.
